Lisa : This is an exceptional book. Written in the first person, as a series of memories and letters to his "daughter", an elderly man in simple, sometimes brutal, terms reveals parts of his life as a Russian male. Spanning the early parts of 20th century Russia to present, as a frame for his life, it's a pithy, witty, sometimes brutal, never ponderous book. I couldn't put it down.

Tim: Why Martin Amis suddenly lost his mojo is a fascinating question. This novel is clearly a labour of love and must have entailed an awful lot of research and work and yet – like all his recent novels it's a novel that has a very faint pulse. The exuberant showmanship of Amis' early writing is rarely on show here. It's the story of a love triangle, sibling rivalry inside a Soviet forced labour camp. There is some good writing but ultimately so much of what happens inside the camp is indiscriminate that the writing itself begins to become indiscriminate too. Not an easy read.

What squicks me is the way it is written such that i believe we're imagined to take the narrator heavily in this point, if even for a minute. and so forth and so on for the following 2 hundred plus pages. the opposite factor that left me a bit, "...is this for real?" is the large revelation on the finish of the book. whilst the narrator ultimately unearths out what occurred among his brother and his brother's spouse in the home of conferences in the course of their conjugal stopover at fifty years earlier. the article that destroyed his brother. the matter was once the intercourse used to be strong and the brother simply did not care. possibly i am simply now not the objective audience, yet casting this whole tragedy of lives, the whole lot of twentieth century Russian historical past to a few extent, during the prism of the sexual prowess of 2 brothers? Are you kidding me? this is often absolutely an "The global Revolves round My Penis" book, and that i simply do not provide a rattling any more. Points, though, for structure. i discovered myself the main thinking about the addressee of the book, the narrator's late-in-life stepdaughter. i assumed the e-book used to be quite well-constructed in the way it created this whole dating and existence within the clean areas round the tale being told. Points, too, to the writer for having the balls to come back out and say it directly, in the course of the narrator, even - this can be fairly a love tale among the 2 brothers; the ladies are all excuses or intermediaries. (Which, yes, that is type of the purpose of the e-book and the narrator, yet my god i am bored with analyzing severe Books during which the ladies are all excuses or substitutes. i feel that is why the stepdaughter was once so fascinating - she used to be the single lady who seemed within the complete booklet who was once now not judged exclusively on her sexual worth. And, of course, the stepdaughter by no means seemed at all.) Yes, there are a few excellent turns of phrase. Yes, this was once fairly skillfully constructed. yet i am not attracted to literary ideological ponderings lots as i'm in storytelling, and it's totally transparent which was once extra vital during this book. (Plus I simply do not supply a rattling concerning the narrator's penis.)

Saurabh: the only advantage of this publication is that it's particularly readable, i stopped it in sittings (it is helping that i locate the Soviet Union interesting -- in a "thank God I wasnt born there" way). a lot of the remaining frequently feels sturdy and undesirable on the comparable time. The protagonist/narrator *describes* himself as angry, well-read, a battle veteran and rapist, labour-camp survivor, black marketeer, technical professional (ie. he's interesting, flawed, multifarious) yet what *comes across* end result of the writing is a pretentious, literary bore (Amis himself?). The descriptions of the Gulag and insights into the Soviet Union are good put, yet there's no feeling in them. probably the reason is, Amis isnt Russian and it shows: one cant *write* British and *be* Russian even as (apparently the narrator's English is so stable simply because he dated an Englishwoman!). The suspense in regards to the brother's letter is felt good through the reader, yet there's totally no reason behind retaining it. Moreover, the contents of the letter are completely and *pretentiously* anticlimactic. The writing in the direction

of the top feels confused, and it may be simply because after the anticlimax of the letter, all I wished to do was once end the ebook fast. At the whole, now not a nasty read, yet left me with a "what was once the point" upset feeling, so I wouldn't suggest it.

Charles Matthews: With its Dostoevskian anti-hero and its willingness to discover the essence of humanity within the depths of degradation, Martin Amis' apartment of conferences could be the most sensible Russian novel ever written via an Englishman. In 2002, Amis released a slender non-fiction volume, *Koba the Dread*, within which he took liberal intellectuals to activity for normally downplaying Stalin's tyranny compared to Hitler's. It's a comparability that also weighs on Amis' brain in his new novel. The narrator, a Russian gulag survivor, recollects a dialogue he had together with his daughter a couple of paper she used to be writing for college. The question: "in the thirties and forties of the 20th century, who used to be extra disgusting, Russia or Germany? They were, I said. even more disgusting. ... Still, they recovered and we did not. Germany isn't withering away, as Russia is. Rigorous atonement ... reduces the load of the offense. ... In 2004, the German offense is a really a little lighter factor than it was. The Russian offense, in 2004, remains to be an analogous offense." The narrator himself has a lot to atone for. Born in 1919, he's now "a vile-tempered and foul-mouthed previous guy – large and shaggy, my hair now not the downy white of the unprotesting dotard yet a jagged and sour gray." He fought in international battle II and, he tells us, "in the 1st 3 months of 1945, I raped my means throughout what might quickly be East Germany." yet notwithstanding he was once a Communist occasion member, he was once despatched to the gulag, north of the Arctic Circle, as a "socially adverse element" – which means he had an excessive amount of event of the West to be trusted. published in 1958, he enriched himself within the underground economy. "I had drive," he says, "and all Russians hate that." the radical is forged as a memoir addressed to the narrator's daughter. In it, he revisits the positioning of his 14-year imprisonment, this time as a vacationer – he overhears a stewardess bearing on him as "the Gulag bore in 2B." He discovers that where the place the legal camp stood has metamorphosed right into a various type of hell, an industrialized nightmare of unchecked toxins the place packs of untamed canine roam the streets. "Already uninhabitable through any sane standard, Predposylov has long gone directly to turn into possibly the dirtiest position on earth. within the inn there are incredulous environmentalists from Finland, from Japan, from Canada. but nonetheless the voters swirl, and the smokestacks of the Kombinat puke proudly on." Obviously, the narrator hasn't long past there to sightsee. Instead, it's a part of a quest to unravel a secret left over from his days as a prisoner. within the gulag, he used to be reunited along with his half-brother, Lev, who was once nearly his antitype: short, slight, pacifist, the place the narrator is burly and driven. What they've got such a lot in universal is their infatuation with the voluptuous Zoya, Lev's wife. a lot of the unconventional offers with the ways that the brothers continue to exist the horrors of the gulag. however the key occasion occurs within the thaw after Stalin's death, while prisoners are allowed conjugal visits in a spot referred to as the home of Meetings. There, whatever occurs among Lev and Zoya that Lev won't converse about, yet offers to bare in the future to the narrator. This key's infrequently sufficient to propel the novel, and it's attainable to fault the e-book for a scarcity of authenticity: Amis' wit, his tendency to move for the wry and intensely British epigrammatic insight, occasionally works opposed to his try and feign a Russian sensibility. because the narrator places it, "this isn't a rustic of nuance." however the strength of Amis' mind's eye makes up for many of the novel's deficiencies. He has performed his homework – his assets are pointed out within the

acknowledgements. And Amis has understood that his characters are greater than puppets in a piece of fiction. "I am no longer a personality in a unique ... ," the narrator asserts. "Like many thousands of others I and my brother are characters in a piece of social background from below, within the age of the large nonentities." Amis has introduced his characters into emotional focus, to awaken the weight that background has imposed on Russia and the Russians. "Russia realized find out how to crawl, and she or he realized tips to run," the narrator says. "But she by no means realized how one can walk."
