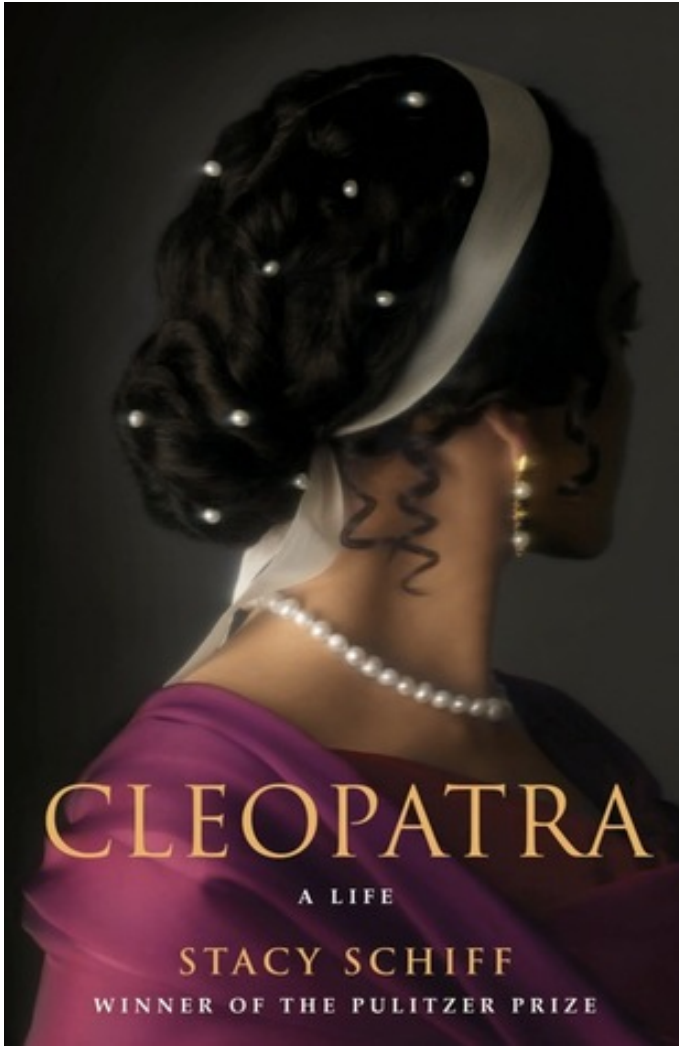

Cleopatra: A Life



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Description

The Pulitzer Prize-winning biographer brings to life the most intriguing woman in the history of the world: Cleopatra, the last queen of Egypt.

Her palace shimmered with onyx, garnet, and gold, but was richer still in political and sexual intrigue. Above all else, Cleopatra was a shrewd strategist and an ingenious negotiator. Though her life spanned fewer than forty years, it reshaped the contours of the ancient world.

She was married twice, each time to a brother. She waged a brutal civil war against the first when both were teenagers. She poisoned the second. Ultimately she dispensed with an ambitious sister as well; incest and assassination were family specialties. Cleopatra appears to have had sex with only two men. They happen, however, to have been Julius Caesar and Mark Antony, among the most prominent Romans of the day. Both were married to other women. Cleopatra had a child with Caesar and--after his murder--three more with his protégé. Already she was the wealthiest ruler in the Mediterranean; the relationship with Antony confirmed her status as the most influential woman of the age. The two would together attempt to forge a new empire, in an alliance that spelled their ends. Cleopatra has lodged herself in our imaginations ever since.

Famous long before she was notorious, Cleopatra has gone down in history for all the wrong reasons. Shakespeare and Shaw put words in her mouth. Michelangelo, Tiepolo, and Elizabeth Taylor put a face to her name. Along the way, Cleopatra's supple personality and the drama of her circumstances have been lost. In a masterly return to the classical sources, Stacy Schiff here boldly separates fact from fiction to rescue the magnetic queen whose death ushered in a new world order. Rich in detail, epic in scope, Schiff's is a luminous, deeply original reconstruction of a dazzling life.

Mo Shah: This one was one of the most highly rated books of the last year, so I added it to my reading list. I'm glad I did, although I'm not entire sure it lived up to its billing.

The author is erudite, and not afraid to show it. What she does successfully is to really give the reader an idea of the context of what the Roman world was like in those days, and the complex political world that was the mediterranean. Understanding that goes a long way to understanding the machinations in Rome and how how murmurs there could set off earthquakes in its vassal states.

What didn't work as well for me was how she brough Cleopatra "to life" for the reader. It's telling that the cover is a picture of a woman turned away, for I didn't feel as I got to know her well. That may well very be an impossible task, for there doesnt seem to be many writings directly from her and most of the history is second and third hand. Viewing her from the lens of her enemies, or trying to take into account a chronicler's prejudices certainly is challenging. So maybe I wanted more than what was available. The authors style doesn't help - burying herself

in erudition as opposed to making the history more relatable. Not that erudition is necessarily a barrier to understanding - the most excellent "Rubicon", by Tom Holland, puts you right at the end of the Roman republic, and no one can say that. Mr. Holland met a word or a colorful turn of phrase that he didn't like.

Anyway, a good history, but not an excellent one. Three stars.

Dana Stabenow: So my book club read Stacy Schiff's [Cleopatra](#) last month.

Every single one of the extant sources who wrote about Cleopatra's life had an agenda, specifically to demonize Cleopatra and make hers a name to live in infamy

...her story is constructed as much of male fear as fantasy.

Cicero, Plutarch, Dio, Lucan, Schiff quotes them all extensively and compensates for their obvious bias by attempting to put the reader in that place and time. In this case the "devil" truly is in the details, right down to the banquet decor

Strewn in heaps over the floors, they lent the impression of a country meadow, if onelittered at meal's end by oyster shells, lobster claws, and peach pits.

Those details make fascinating reading. Take the status of women in Cleopatra's Alexandria

They inherited equally and held property independently. Married women did not submit to their husbands' control. They enjoyed the right to divorce and to be supported after a divorce. Until the time an ex-wife's dowry was returned, she was entitled to be lodged in the house of her choice. Her property remained hers, it was not to be squandered by a wastrel husband. The law sided with the wife and children if a husband acted against their interests...They loaned money and operated barges. They served as priests in the native temples. They initiated lawsuits and hired flute players. As wives, widows, or divorcees, they owned vineyards, wineries, papyrus marshes, ships, perfume businesses, milling equipment, slaves, homes, camels. As much as one third of Ptolemaic Egypt may have been in female hands.

Considering that Schiff is writing about Egypt circa 55 BC (yes, BC) that's a bit of an eye-opener. Intelligent and extensively educated, Cleopatra spoke seven languages, and was the only Ptolemy ever to learn Egyptian, the native tongue of most of her subjects. She was smart enough to embrace the role of Isis in all public ceremonies and annual celebrations, becoming not only queen but goddess. This made her so popular that in the twenty-two years she reigned, she never faced a rebellion, the only Ptolemy of whom that can be said.

This was a terrific discussion book, partly because there is nothing to tell us how Cleopatra really thought and felt. Everything has to be inferred by her actions, and most of those were reported by men influenced by Octavian, later Caesar Augustus

[Octavian] celebrates [Cleopatra's] defeat before it has occurred. Virgil and Propertius were on hand for the Egyptian triumph, by which time both the asp [according to Schiff, it wasn't an asp, it was very probably poison made by Cleopatra's own hand] and Cleopatra's pernicious influence were already set in stone. In every reckoning Antony is made to flee Actium on Cleopatra's account. She helpfully illuminated one of Propertius's favorite points: a man in love is a helpless man, shamefully subservient to his mistress. It is as if Octavian delivers Rome from that ill as well. He has restored the natural order of things: men ruled women, and Rome ruled the world. On both counts, Cleopatra was crucial to the story.

Not to mention which, the treasure Octavian looted from Egypt paid his way to power in Rome. Since this is my blog and I get to write what I want, I think Cleopatra was always a queen first and a lover second. Caesar became her lover by default. He was the man on the ground, the representative of the Roman Empire who was going to decide who reigned in Egypt, Cleopatra or her brother. She had no choice, she had to seduce Caesar over to her side, and she did, and that plus a little matter of fratricide put her on her throne and kept her there for twenty-two years.

Until another man knocked her off. Schiff writes

She got a very good deal right, and one crucial thing wrong.

That one crucial thing was, of course, Marc Antony. But, again, what choice did Cleopatra really have? Octavian, Lepidus and Antony carved up the Roman world between them and Antony got the eastern Mediterranean, which included Egypt. Again, Antony was the Roman on the ground, the guy with the legions. She invited him to Alexandria and she seduced him into supporting her, but when he left she didn't see him again for three years. Schiff doesn't report any credible evidence that Cleopatra pined for him, she got on with the business of ruling her country. Nor did he pine for her, he married Octavian's sister and they lived together in Athens in what sounds like amity and affection.

It isn't until he returns from Parthia, a beaten man, that passion seems to overcome all else and he turns into an octopus, holding on to Cleopatra with all eight arms. By then Antony needed Cleopatra a lot more than she needed him and she knew it, but again, what was she going to do? She had deliberately seduced him to keep her throne and her country, and he was still the man in charge of her part of the world. Her distress at his death, all that weeping and wailing and tearing of hair and breast, that wasn't grief, that was part show, for the watching Roman

soldiers in hopes that it would sway Octavian to let her keep her throne, but mostly rage, against the doofus who let her and Egypt down. She had to know by then that this was not only the end of her but the end of her country as anything but a client state of Rome. I'd have been pissed, too.

One of the fun things about a book like this is indulging in "what if." When everyone and his brother was deserting Antony (deservedly so, what a wretched general, this was a guy who had only one good battle in him), what if Cleopatra had deserted, too, what if she had reached out to Octavian? She was in Rome on the Ides of March when Caesar was assassinated in the Forum, she was there when his will was read. He left Antony nothing. He chose Octavian as his heir. Caesar obviously knew both men well, and wrote his will accordingly. What if she had taken her cue from him?

And the latest news in the life of Cleopatra? David Fincher is making [a film based on this book](#) starring Angelina Jolie. This woman just won't die.

One last note: I wanted to give a shout-out to the cover art. It's rich in color and almost tactile, opalescent even, reminiscent of Cleopatra's lush life in Alexandria, but what I love is that her face is turned away from us, her features obscured in shadow. We can never truly know her.

But Schiff sure gives it the red-shift limit try.

Charlotte: One of those books that's kind of disappointing, after all the hype, but you feel virtuous for having read it. The obvious problem is that so little is actually known about Cleopatra from firsthand or sympathetic sources that a real biography is impossible. Schiff has done a commendable job of presenting and assessing the available information but Cleopatra's emotional presence is elusive; she probably raises more questions than she answers. I think I was hoping for a cleaner narrative along the lines of historical fiction to bring this story to life. But Schiff's goal was to rescue the few facts we have about Cleopatra and try to put it into context, and she succeeds. At first, her extravagant, clever style distracts from the substance. But I think once you get into the story its momentum carries you along. Even without emotional padding, the stark facts illustrating Cleopatra's ability to survive against the worst odds, and her intelligence and courage in facing the loss of everything, is incredibly moving. Worth it just for the last 50 pages.

Michael: assessment from Badelynge. In 2000 Stacy Schiff gained a Pulitzer for her biography of Vera Nabokov, spouse of writer Vladimir Nabokov. During this biography she casts her getting to know abilities a bit additional again in time and attempts to pierce the glare and glamour of mythology, push prior the propaganda and traverse the abyss of 2000 years of historical past looking for Cleopatra VII. To hand she has a wealth of resources that would be as daunting as trying to find fact buried through millennia of hyperbole and obscurity. On old historians

Schiff comments, "They are via glossy criteria polemicists, apologists, moralists, fabulists, recyclers, cut-and-pasters, hacks." She units out as her undertaking plan, in facing such a lot of biased, harmful stories and incomplete evidence, such a lot of which written centuries after the development or destroyed through the censor of the positive or the ravages of time and environment, not to upload to the confusion together with her personal reviews and supposition yet rather, as she places it, to coral the probabilities. because in line with Schiff, Cleopatra VII, "Effectively ceases to exist with no Roman within the room." it's no shock that this account pretty well starts with the younger queen rolling out of that recognized traveling sack on the ft of Caesar. heritage does not do childhoods apparently. in lots of methods the writer turns out to signify that Cleopatra and Egypt at the moment have been synonymous, and within the absence of a transparent account of the woman, an in depth portrait of Alexandria and Egyptian society must suffice, at first at least. it really is with a notice of indignation that Schiff bemoans that during an age of accomplished, reasonable portraiture there's not a unmarried authoritative bust of Cleopatra. The Romans normal opinion of either the girl and her kingdom was: "A disgrace to lose, a danger to conquer, a headache to govern." Portraiture apart there's it slow spent in supposing why Cicero, that prolific Roman speaker and writer, (Schiff costs him ceaselessly within the first half the book) says so little of Cleopatra in the course of her time in Rome. the second one half the ebook is ruled through Cleopatra's first assembly with Mark Antony. If there are a virtually countless variety of issues we do not recognize evidently approximately Cleopatra, something we do recognize is that the girl may throw one hell of a party. the luxurious dinners she held in Tarsus, essentially to court docket Antony have been unimaginably opulent, although Plutarch, our basic resource for those overblown nosh-ups, turns out to have had a superb attempt. Or was once it basically an organization in response to political and army machinations? Schiff provides the facts yet leaves the query unanswered. eventually it's a query that's unanswerable past mere opinion or preference. an excessive amount of time has passed. an excessive amount of Roman propaganda disseminated. Too many myths have accrued. And as historical past turns into entertainment, from Shakespeare to Elizabeth Taylor, the truth, even have been it known, by no means attracts the best crowd. And so that you can maybe one of many maximum death-bed scenes of history, notwithstanding back as an end-game of such notoriety actually obscured by way of the grand stage. After Mark Antony's bloody dying the negotiations among Cleopatra and Octavian and her eventual end, as represented by means of history, are differentiated through Schiff through mise-en-scene; Plutarch is writing for Puccini; Dio for Wagner. "'The fact of the matter,' Plutarch announces, to centuries of deaf ears, 'No one knows.'" Schiff publicizes that Octavian created the parable of the snake, slightly propaganda that caught to the development so indelibly it could actually by no means be separated, even within the face of loads contradictory evidence.
