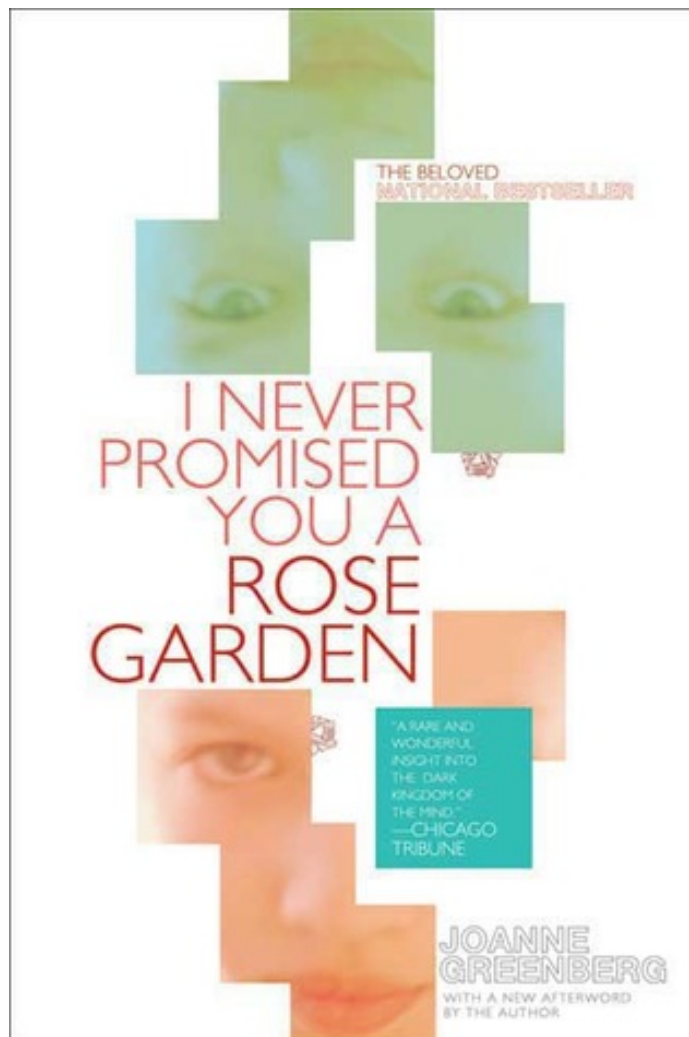

I. S.: I first read this book as a young teen, probably not more than 14 years after it was published. I remember being fascinated by Deborah's internal world of Yr more than anything else. To the best of my knowledge I am not mentally ill, but I was socially awkward and lived in my own head so much I remember even trying to see if I could find my way into Yr, not truly grasping that it was a construct Deborah had made up to protect herself from the world.

Re-reading it now, as an adult, I'm aware of all of that, plus the changes that have come in the treatment of mental illness since the book was written. I still think it is a wonderful book, and found myself nearly tearing up for joy at the point where Deborah realizes she is alive in the world. I think that those readers who criticise the book because the diagnoses and treatments don't match up with what we know today need to step back and try to remember that we still know so little about how the mind works, and that 45 years ago, things were very different.

And a part of me is still totally fascinated by Yr.
