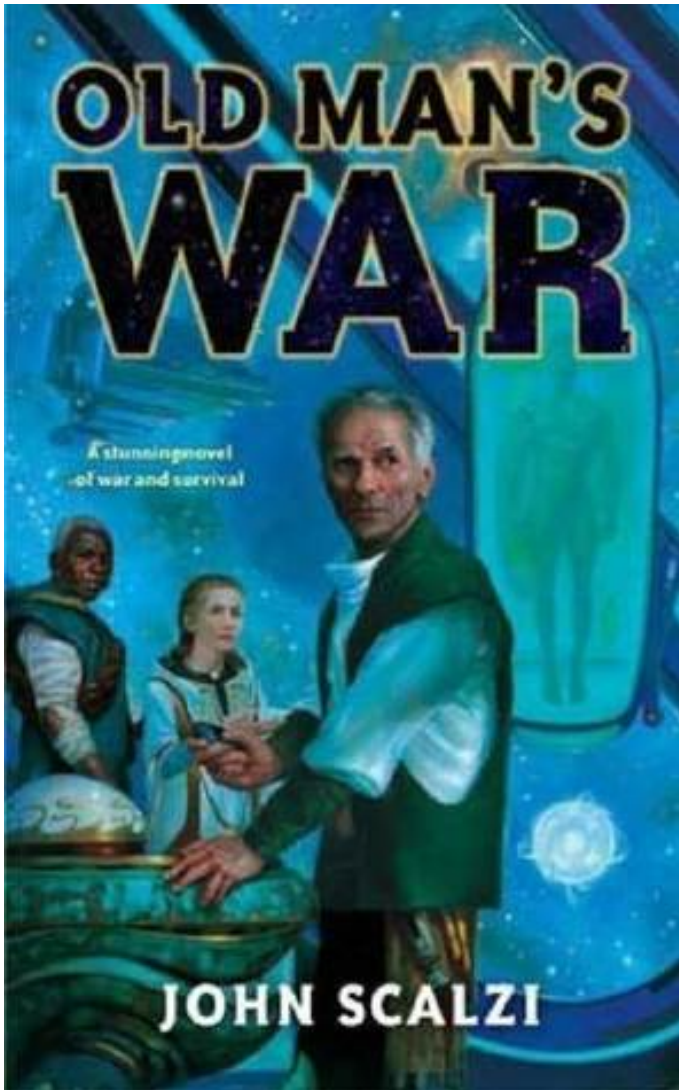

Description

With his wife dead and buried, and life nearly over at 75, John Perry takes the only logical course of action left him: he joins the army. Now better known as the Colonial Defense Force (CDF), Perry's service-of-choice has extended its reach into interstellar space to pave the way for human colonization of other planets while fending off marauding aliens. The CDF has a trick up its sleeve that makes enlistment especially enticing for seniors: the promise of restoring youth. After bonding with a group of fellow recruits who dub their clique the Old Farts, Perry finds himself in a new body crafted from his original DNA and upgraded for battle, including fast-clotting "smartblood" and a brain-implanted personal computer. All too quickly the Old Farts are separated, and Perry fights for his life on various alien-infested battlegrounds. Scalzi's blending of wry humor and futuristic warfare recalls Joe Haldeman's classic, *The Forever War* (1974), and strikes the right fan--pleasing chords to probably garner major sf award nominations. How do you fulfill a promise to tackle a complicated subject like human mortality and aging using believable science fiction tropes, exploring a premise of why septuagenarians would make excellent soldiers in a futuristic space war?

Easy. You don't.

Parallel Universe

Old Man's War is really two books in one: *Old Man* and *War*.

Old Man is a well written, thoughtful, and at times emotionally wrenching fictional memoir. It doesn't require a science fiction setting to make the reader think about bereavement, reflection, and the inevitable question of, at the end of your life, what comes next?

War is a Heinleinesque space romp full of aliens to be shot, blown up, and slashed, spaceship drives to be reverse engineered, and advanced theoretical physics like multi-verses to be explained. We've got a meta wink-and-nod to modern commercial trademarks as applied to advanced human implants and biological improvements, not to mention human enhancement agreements that are suspiciously similar to the ones twenty-first century computer users are familiar with when opening software packages. There's sex and humor and violence that's well written, fun, and thought-provoking.

Shell Game

But the bait and switch at the heart of the book is what keeps this from being a real classic. The moment the story stops being *Old Man* and turns to *War* is a bright, harsh line in the book and

the two tracks are rarely integrated.

The fact that John Perry is 75 years old is tangential to the action of the story and, in fact, age as a factor disappears within the first couple of chapters [not coincidentally, as soon as he gets the body of a twenty year old]. Perry could've been a twenty-year old for all the impact the story makes on him personally.

Disappointingly, Scalzi dodges any character growth we could justifiably expect to see. As someone who's lived a full span, John should bring a lifetime of learning, wisdom, and experience to bear on the plot...while having to overcome the prejudices, assumptions, and iron-clad beliefs of seventy-plus years.

That's the point, right? Countless times, we've seen the *bildungsroman* of young Starship Troopers thrown into the fire, hopefully to come out the other side scarred, smarter, and more mature. But what happens when we're given the reverse, an old man who's been given a second chance? You won't find out here.

The Carrot

That's the bad. Here's the good: for all my ranting, *OMW* is still a great read. It's fun, fast, thoughtful in just the right way in many places. The twists are twisty and the revelations satisfying. And, not to be lost in the weeds, Scalzi has had so much success so quickly, it's hard to remember that this was a debut novel. For any failings I might be pointing out, it's an amazing debut and will justifiably find its way onto many Top 100 SF lists.

Random Thoughts

- From Scalzi's blog, *Whatever*, I know he's a thoughtful, compassionate person who spends a lot of time defending Good Things. So his (slight) brush-off of Perry's futuristic version of PTSD--brought on by alien genocide, no less--was perplexing and troubling.

It's a short, semi-humorous chapter reminiscent of some Viet Nam war flick where hard-bitten GI's in the Phoenix program shrug off responsibility for torching a Viet Cong village. If the light treatment is meant via irony to actually convey a sense of horror and import, it falls flat.

This is even more puzzling in the sense that a military SF novel is the perfect time and place to address serious real-world issues like genocide and PTSD, especially from the perspective of a 75 year-old who, had the author wanted to, been witness to both from his "previous" life.

- Ditto, to a lesser extent, the sarcasm of the chapter about the former politician who tries diplomacy, rather than bullets, on an alien species. Having him ripped to shreds is gratuitous, low-hanging fruit, a cheap literary laugh. Maybe it wasn't the direction Scalzi wanted to go for his SF soldier romp, but it seemed unworthy of the book.

- Maybe I didn't stress it enough, but the Old Man parts of the novel are the most redeeming sections and what really rescue it from being a run-of-the-mill SF first-person-shooter. Coming out of it is one of the sweetest pieces of pure writing I've seen in science fiction in a long time:

I miss my wife. It's easier to miss her at a cemetery, where she's never been anything but dead, than to miss her in all the places where she was alive.

Summary

Old Man's War is well worth your time, even if you don't normally read science fiction. While Scalzi might dodge some of the very issues he raises, it's interesting that *OMW* will still make you think about them. It's a testament to just how good the book is that I can level some pretty serious philosophical criticisms at it...and it still remains standing. I look forward to reading the rest in the *OMW* series and giving them the same work out.

Apatt: Wow! that book flew by! Very immersive book with lots of cool tech, a sense of wonder, and a sense of humor (though some of the jokes fall flat for me). This is not a "comedy sf" book however, there is some pathos, sentimentality and romance also. Initially I thought it was going to be a *Starship Trooper* ripoff, but it is much more than that (also reminds me of *Ender's Game* a little too). The best thing about this book for me is how ideas pile upon ideas and the main protagonist is worth rooting for (not a Mary Sue).

Edit Sept 24, 2013: Some books mature like fine wine and get better with rereads, a few become less likeable in retrospect. This is one of those few. There are some laughs in this book but the glaring juvenile humour just weakens the book. So a reduction of one star seems appropriate, I'd still recommend it as a good read though.

David: This is John Scalzi's signature novel, the one that kicked off his popular military SF series and was supposedly going to be made into a movie.

I have enjoyed a lot of Scalzi's novels, but always found him to be a good writer, an entertaining writer, but never a *great* writer.

Old Man's War leaves me...underwhelmed.

By his own admission, this book is a Heinlein tribute. Hence the obvious similarities to Heinlein's "signature novel" (I suppose Heinlein purists might argue about this), *Starship Troopers*. It's got the same basic theme — humans going out into space and gotta toughen up to fight a hostile universe full of aliens who want to kill us. But what was glaringly apparent to this ex-military dude is that Scalzi, unlike Heinlein, has never worn a uniform and never spent much time hanging out with actual military folks. And when it comes to hostile, advanced aliens who would just as soon flick us off the table, David Brin does it so, so much better.

Old Man's War does have a lot of nifty and novel ideas. The "Old Man" of the novel is John Perry (a painfully Mary Sue-ish authorial stand-in - I mean, come on John, couldn't you at least have given your protagonist a different first name?), who at age 75 signs up for the Colonial Defense Force. Although humans are now colonizing other star systems, no one on Earth knows exactly what the situation is like out there among the stars. Hence the first few chapters

reading like Anytown, Ohio (bearing a startling resemblance to John Scalzi's home town) has basically not changed in centuries. The CDF accepts septuagenarians into its service, who are never seen on Earth again. It is assumed that they have some sort of advanced technology to rejuvenate their elderly recruits, since otherwise why the hell would a military want old people with one foot in the grave? But no one knows exactly what the process is - when you sign up for the CDF, it's a one-way trip.

So John Perry leaves Earth, and finds out what the deal is - they're given vat-grown super-soldier bodies with green skin.



From here, we have Scalzi attempting to write all the usual military SF cliches - band of new recruits bonds, goes through basic training under the harsh tutelage of a weak imitation of Sergeant Zim who tells them that everything they know about the military and fighting aliens is wrong, etc., etc..

Once out of basic, Perry goes from one battle to another with the expected loss of friends in various encounters, but despite the bloody massacre in which he's the sole survivor of a bungled invasion and the graphic depiction of his injuries, it all feels so very bloodless. The verisimilitude just isn't there. The men and women of the CDF act like civilians who are going to an office job that happens to be very dangerous and involve aliens shooting at them, they don't really act like *soldiers*. Scalzi has no sense of the actual camaraderie formed under fire - his

"band of brothers and sisters" is more like your old college gang getting together for boardgame night. He tries and fails to write convincingly about the attachment formed between a soldier and his weapons. There is no sense of the discomfort and *crudeness* of military life, even if they are flying around in starships. When John Perry encounters the "Ghost Brigades" - the CDF's special forces - Scalzi tries to convey the gap between CDF regulars and the Special Forces, but he's got no sense of what inter-service rivalry is really like.

And the aliens - the Consu, the Rraey - well, I've seen other reviewers praise Scalzi for writing "alien aliens" who aren't like Star Trek humans-in-latex-mask aliens, and I just don't see it. Sure, because in written form you can *describe* your aliens as being physically very different from humans, the aliens the CDF fights are not at all human in appearance, but even the Rraey, who think it's just peachy to eat other sentients, are described in very human terms. (They have a "celebrity chef" who broadcasts a cooking show about how to prepare humans. Maybe this was supposed to be funny, but it just made the Rraey seem cartoonish to me.)

I think this book will appeal to people who like "light sci-fi" but it is not really military sci-fi, even if it is about a colonial military fighting aliens. People generally like Scalzi for his humanistic style of writing, and in that sense perhaps he is the anti-Heinlein. This review may seem mostly negative, but I enjoyed *Old Man's War* and will probably read the other books in the series, but I didn't love it. It's not that it struck any wrong notes, just too many not-quite-right ones.

Scalzi describes the particular battles which keep on with with out much less intensity, yet as soon as John begins fighting, the feel of who he's particularly will get lost. (I used to be really watching for that to be published to be a part of the point, however it wasn't.) John simply turns into A Soldier, virtually instantly. along with his feel of loyalty and his lingering emotions approximately his useless wife, there's little or no left to attach him to who he used to be. It's pointed out a number of occasions that John and his spouse protested the large struggle on Earth, yet John turns out nearly completely unconcerned with the unquestioning bloodbath of assorted alien species. i need to admit, it began to make me a liiiiittle uncomfortable. Scalzi has acknowledged that his idea for this ebook was once Robert Heinlein's *Starship Troopers*, and this book, I think, faces most of the similar difficulties I've heard are inherent in that one. (I haven't really learn it, so if I'm manner off base, please inform me.) Both, I believe, stroll the road among criticizing warfare and glorifying it, and so no matter what message effects is more or less muddled. I acquired the main leisure out of previous Man's warfare while I, well, simply attempted to not give it some thought too much. no longer an angle I frequently endorse, yet there you go. Still, the underlying sci-fi
