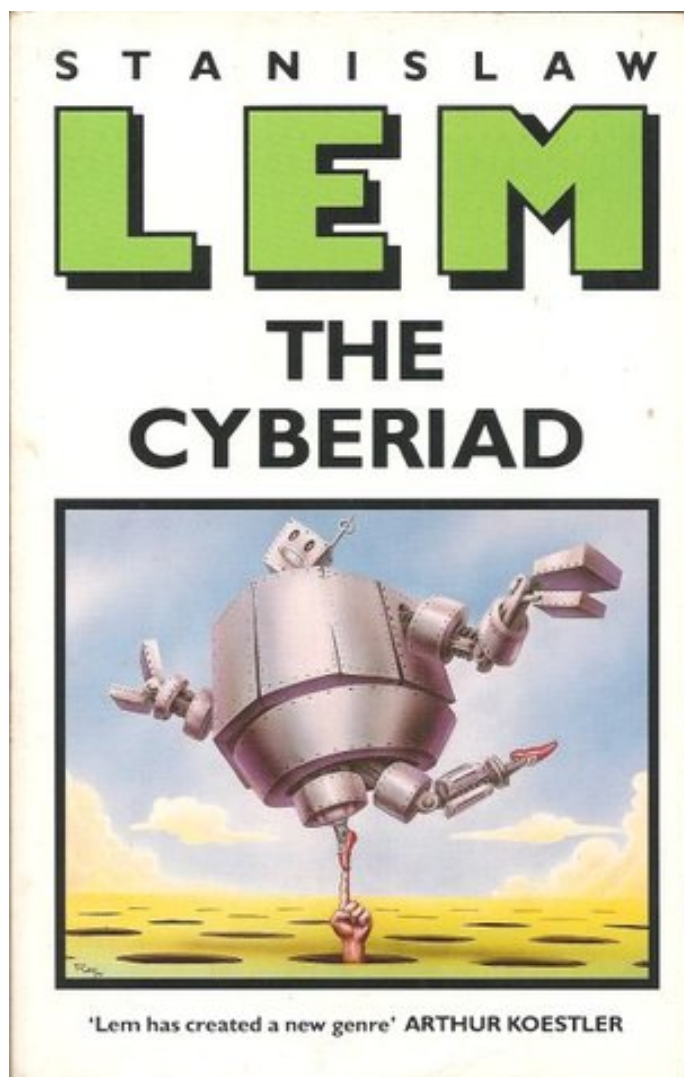

Kind of cartoonish fables with robots and kingdoms. All stories feature the same two 'constructors'. There's probably some social or political satire here that I'm not getting. I'm pretty sure I've read one of these stories in high school. I like to imagine it as animated in my head.

I've read all but the 2 long ones at the end.

The author is obviously a genius, but depth of characterization you will not get. If you're especially knowledgeable about math terms, this could be a treat for you. There's lots of amazing wordplay, and paragraphs that go on for over a page. It's hard to believe this was written in Polish. Kudos for the audiobook narrator for pronouncing all the made up names. You could say there's a sense of wonder in some of the imagery, but it's more like a Tex Avery Droopy dog cartoon, where anything can happen at any moment, or perhaps Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy?

The book has nice illustrations.

Charles Dee Mitchell: Trurl and Klapaucius are constructors. In the brilliant opening story, Trurl constructs a machine that can make anything beginning with the letter "n." Klapaucius, impressed but always eager to put his friend's machines to the test, asks it to create "nothing." The crisis that ensues is typical of a Stanislaw Lem short story. The machine can barely be stopped before the entire world disappears.

Trurl and Klapaucius are themselves machines. This is made clear in another story when Klapaucius, to make a point, beats Trurl about the head with a crow bar, producing dents rather than a bloody pulp. As constructors they are constantly in the employ of rulers of the various kingdoms and planets they encounter. (This is science fiction aligned with the world of fairy tales and medieval romance.) The kingdoms are often at war, and the rulers are frequently greedy or dimwitted. The impulsive Trurl adds to chaotic situations more often than he remedies them. It is up to Klapaucius to set things right – or "rightish." Then, like the knight errants of the stories Lem evokes, the two constructors sally forth to further adventures.

As in *Star Diaries*, Lem's tales are entertaining but exhausting and best taken in small doses. The wordplay, the impossible names, the cobbled together scientific nomenclature wears me down. I'd really like an audio version of these stories, one narrated by an actor who has mastered the language readers are likely to stumble over or glide past. Going the distance is

worthwhile for those moments that are laugh-out-loud funny, or those in which the braininess sidles into the profound.

Greg: I first came across Stanislaw Lem by way of an absolutely fantastic book called [The Mind's I: Fantasies and Reflections on Self and Soul](#) in which three of his short stories were featured. His stories touched on issues in philosophy, topics having to do with artificial intelligence, consciousness, physics, mathematics programming, and more. Upon reading these my thoughts were something along the lines of, "this is one of the most fabulous authors I've ever come across, how have I never heard of him?" I picked up *The Cyberiad* because I knew it contained two of the short stories I had read and assumed the quality of the book as a whole was on par with my experience, but halfway through *The Cyberiad* I my thinking was more along the lines of, "what the hell is this?"

The Cyberiad is a collection of short stories that take place in a very distant future, revolving around two characters name Trurl and Klaupacius, synthetic conscious robot type lifeforms in a universe where humans are but a distant memory. Trurl and Klaupacius are constructors, which means their profession involves building everything from the smartest machine in the universe, to an entire universe housed within a glass ball. Stanislaw Lem was obviously brilliant. The man understood physics and computing at a level far beyond his time, especially for a science fiction writer. His stories are infused with so much scientific terminology and mathematics that a reader not familiar with these terms might as well be reading gibberish. And herein lies half the problem. While his knowledge of these ideas is obvious, the way he uses them is often times nonsensical. Not only is the use of these terms and ideas mostly nonsensical, but the stories they are contained within and wrapped around are mostly nonsensical themselves. Many of the stories are absurdest. I would assume they were written for children if it wasn't for the complexity of the vocabulary and ideas.

For those readers that have read *The Neverending Story*, picture the story telling style contained within that book(the randomness and seeming inexhaustible supply of non sequiturs and incidental information) in a science fiction setting written by Douglas Adams on acid. It wasn't until over half way through the book before the stories started incorporating a more serious philosophical underbelly. In the end the last few stories were recognizable to me as the author that initially amazed me so. Even till the very end they all contain some element of absurdism, but you can tell there is more going on. If the earlier stories had anything more to them, I must be too dense to have figured it out. This is a bit unfair. Almost every single story within the book had some very smart and ingenious aspect to it. But was for the most part lost within absurd narrative going on around it.

Douglas Adams has a way of being absurd that still remains engaging and entertaining and somehow always feels like there is deep meaning infused in each progressive paragraph. Stanislaw Lem had the opportunity to create that, but chose a different path. Still, these stories are FUNNY. And the word play and narrative structure is really brilliant. I was continuously amazed that this wasn't written in english because so much of the comedy and style depended on a very specific structure. Kudos to whoever did this translation.

Melanti: If I needed to decide only one notice to explain Lem's fiction, it might be "experimental." all of the books by means of him that i have learn to date were so enormously various from each other - and infrequently diversified from anything i have learn as well! This specific ebook is a booklet of brief tales a few pair of robots who run round the universe developing different robots. in lots of places, it rather jogs my memory of folklore trickster tales, elsewhere The Arabian Nights Entertainments, and in nonetheless others simply universal silliness. it is a lot of enjoyable and a complete lot extra available than a few of his different paintings (such as Memoirs present in a tub that encouraged the "lemming" of Sword & Laser infamy) and that i imagine it should attract even those that usually are not die-hard sci-fi fans. In addition, i have to assert this can be some of the most exceptional items of translation i have come upon in a long, lengthy time. all of the extraordinary jokes and wordplay - together with made up words, alliteration, poetry, be aware video games - are all translated wonderfully. they are not word-for-word translations, of course. one of these factor would not paintings in any respect with this kind of book. yet Kandel took adequate liberties with the textual content that if a funny story simply could not be at once translated and nonetheless be funny, he changed it with an identical examining English joke. that's really daring, yet that is relatively the one means this kind of booklet may well ever be translated. Voss Foster: I first ran around the Cyberiad in desperation. It takes me subsequent to no time to learn books, so I fast tired each final inch of our bookshelves through 8th grade, and the library had nothing. Now, in terms of the writing of Lem himself, you succeed in a brand new level. such a lot science-fiction enthusiasts will gladly pontificate the gospel of the ecu sci-fi authors, and Lem is definitely a good between them, in no small half as a result of the Cyberiad. whereas fanatics of tough sci-fi may well locate the ridiculous, operatic, humorous, pseudo-scientific tales pretty well revolting (though I doubt it), nobody can deny the distinctiveness of his worldbuilding (surprisingly deep, for nonsense) or the wonderful anti-hero, Trurl. I think bad no longer with the ability to provide more, in case an individual hasn't learn it, however it wouldn't be correct to bare the dignity here. Suffice it to claim that this could continue to exist each bookshelf, genre-bound or literati, and may be reread frequently and with a lot gusto. a real piece of art.

(Presumably a ton of credits needs to visit the translator, too: this e-book is filled with puns that should have been a true soreness to translate from Polish yet are still continuously excellent.) Aside from the physics jokes, "The Cyberiad" comprises the adventures of Klapaucius and Trurl. Like just about all characters within the book, they're robots: not like these characters, they're "constructors", which turns out to intend that they could construct absolutely anything given definitely the right (or, really, any) materials. many of the tales include Trurl and/or Klapaucius construction anything -- the stupidest pondering desktop within the complete world, an digital poet, an ideal miniature international -- and the mayhem that results.
