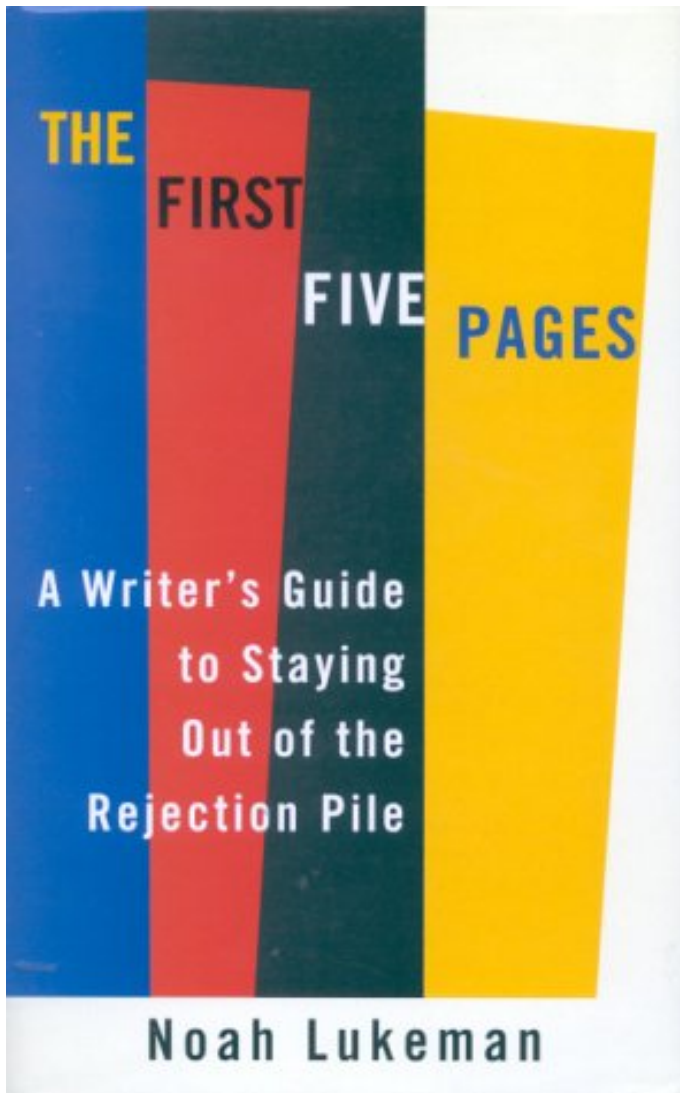

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Description

The difference between *The First Five Pages* and most books on writing is that the others are written by teachers and writers. This one comes from a literary agent--one whose clients include Pulitzer Prize nominees, *New York Times* bestselling authors, Pushcart Prize recipients, and American Book Award winners. Noah Lukeman is not trying to impart the finer points of writing well. He wants to teach you "how to identify and avoid bad writing," so that your manuscript doesn't come boomeranging back to you in that self-addressed, stamped envelope. Surprise: Agents and editors don't read manuscripts for fun; they are looking for reasons to reject them. Lukeman has arranged his book "in the order of what I look for when trying to dismiss a manuscript," starting with presentation and concluding with pacing and progression. Each chapter addresses a pitfall of poor writing--overabundance of adjectives and adverbs, tedious or unrealistic dialogue, and lack of subtlety to name just a few--by identifying the problem, presenting solutions, giving examples (one wishes these weren't quite so obvious), and offering writing exercises. It's a little bizarre to think about approaching your work as would an agent, but if you are serious about getting published, you may as well get used to it. Plus, Lukeman has plenty of solid advice worth listening to. Particularly fine are his exercises for removing and spicing up modifiers and his remedies for all kinds of faulty dialogue. --Jane Steinberg

Res: Lukeman's 0 for 2 now; this one's even less useful than [The Plot Thickens](#).

To start with, the whole "first five pages" thing is a bait-and-switch; it suggests that the book is specifically focused on beginnings, but in fact, Lukeman says, "If there are too many adjectives in the first five pages, then there will be too many all the way through." Which makes your book different from every other "how to write" book how?

As seems to be common among writing books, half the advice is obvious (avoid bad grammar) and the other half is poorly explained (make your pacing excellent).

Also, when he recommends choosing synonyms to mix it up a little instead of boring your reader with 'said,' what little credibility he has with me takes a big hit.

He may know good writing when he sees it, but he sure can't teach it.

C.S. Boag: This is one book that aspiring writers must read. Lukeman to discover what you must do and avoid to get published.

All my life I thought I could do both- live a normal life and write. It's only now that I realise I can't. It is a heady time I am 71.

In the last few years I have had five books published, before that it has been journalism and a few short stories. It has taken all this time to realise that writing is a full-time business. Lukeman is new to me- but, oh, how right he is. He is an agent and knows his way round both manuscripts and publishing houses. He doesn't waste words. It is all covered (bar, for some odd reason, plotting) in 200 pages. Get it right, writers, he says: and this is how you do it.

This is one book that is a key to the magic portal.
Read it, heed what they say, and write.

Review: I would recommend *Self-Editing for Fiction Writers* over this book. However, if you're looking for another slightly different list of issues to look for in your writing, go ahead and read this book.

The advice in this one was solid, but other elements of it weren't:

* Silly, obvious examples—Showing examples of what you're talking about: Awesome. Showing examples that were obviously constructed just for the purpose of this book and were so ridiculous that only a complete idiot could have written them: Not so awesome. The examples didn't really help me at all.

* Exercises for the sake of exercises—A few times, the writing exercises at the end of each chapter seemed arbitrary, like someone just thought them up and stuck them in the book without stopping to test whether they were actually helpful. I'd rather have a couple tried-and-true exercises than a bucket of this-seems-like-it-might-work exercises.
